Membership data reflects a growing trend of both members and first-choice forum, which is encouraging.

Reflections on 2024 (Outputs and outcomes):

The forum committee holds 6 weekly meetings for one hour online to discuss projects, plans and outcomes – our listen, learn and lead strategy has been enacted with committee members.

All Committee members have contributed to the following outputs:

- Monthly blogs which have been published on the forum webpage.
- Monthly publications in Gastrointestinal Nursing (GIN) publications and also the committee have contributed to peer reviews for the GIN.
- The forum committee has had a strong presence at national conferences, committee members have not only attended but have presented at, the National Colorectal Cancer Nurses Conference, the British Liver Nurses Association, the BSG 2024, the Gastrointestinal Nursing Congress and the European Crohn's and Colitis Organisation 2024. Presentations have demonstrated the forum's commitment to advanced practice, development of strategy and standards and all presentations were well received.
- Following a successful Forum Governance Group bid for funding, the forum committee have started work on the 4th Edition of the Liver competencies. This update will be completed in 2025 with support from the wider forum membership who are providing expert writers for the competency document.
- The committee have supported a successful FGG bid by a group of paediatric gastro CNS to develop Paediatric Gastro IBD competencies. The committee

will work alongside an expert writing group to deliver this project in 2025, and additionally the CYP forum committee will be supporting this project.

- We have published the IBD framework for professional practice in January 2024
 – already downloaded approximately 900 times. Work commenced on evaluating the impact of the IBD framework.
- We provided accreditation for the National Colorectal Cancer Nurses (NCCNN) Conference, at which 132 CRC CNS's attended.

Claire Coughlan continues to run the MSc In Colorectal Disease, with bursaries offered to CRC CNS's via BCUK. She has published her Systematic Review on the follow up priorities of CRC patients and is a member of the steering committee for the best practice pathway led by the ASCN, first meeting is on 2nd December.

Pearl Avery has set up a National IBD nurse research group and has had abstracts accepted at BSG and ECCO she has worked on the latest IBD guidelines and has recently joined the IBDUK standards review group.

Congress 2024 was attended by 3 committee members who enjoyed the opportunity for networking with other forum members and the wider RCN membership.

We supported successful endorsement of 'Practice recommendations for midwives caring for women and birthing people living with IBD' developed by a multidisciplinary group of HCPs including midwives, IBD nurses (Forum members), clinicians, GPs and patients.

We contributed to a working party of IBD CNS and researchers on an IBD Advice Line project.
