6. James King, HIV Story Project Manager

James briefs the steering committee on the background work of the HIV story project which has been funded by the national lottery.

The National HIV Story Trust (NHST) films, records and preserves the stories of those affected by the AIDS pandemic of the 1980s and 90s. The NHST hopes the 120+ interviews filmed with survivors and families, partners and medical professionals will be a voice for those who did not survive, a chance to honour those who did, and an education for those who live so freely today.

The interview footage has been donated to the London Archive for public and research access and as a record in perpetuity. Arrange access to the archive here.

- Engaging with people under 40 who are not aware of the history and wanting to learn new skills and learn more about the history.

The London Archive holds the current recordings. Now they are looking at stories from nurse carers. The HONF will be participating in interviews across the four countries.

DY will be sending out an email to all members requesting volunteers and training will be given.

There will be a popup exhibition telling peoples stories, steering committee volunteers to talk at these events.
