## Future and current projects


- ESN competencies updates completed and ratified by RCN in 2023 (all 3 specialities)
- Facebook, Linked in, X (Twitter) presence increasing
- Treatment & Prescribing Day planning for 2025 -1 day meeting in Birmingham
- ESNA have taken over the ownership of the Joint Epilepsy Council guidelines for Epilepsy Awareness and Rescue Medication Training Programmes, these were re-launched in 2023 and are being picked up by CQC as good practice guidelines. There is also a carer competency checklist (both are free on the ESNA website)



- ESNA are working with NICE, MHRA, ILAE, RCPsych, SIGN
- Working with ILAE on best practice maternity guidelines and emergency care guidelines
- Working with NHS England on the epilepsy pathway
- Working with the MHRA on the Valproate guidelines & risk assessment (Prevent)

## **ESNA** Competencies

- There are separate competencies for Epilepsy Specialist Nurses for children, adults and supporting people with learning disabilities.
   These were updated in 2023 and the plan is for them all to be amalgamated into one document from the next review with specialised sections for role specific information.
- They have 3 levels within them; novice, competent, expert (roughly aligned with bands 6, 7 and 8).
- Each framework identifies the knowledge and understanding needed to demonstrate each level of practice.
- They are RCN ratified standards for ESNs
- Written by Epilepsy Specialist Nurses in consultation with ESNA, RCN and other key individuals and organisations, these are updated every 2 years
