**RCN comment:** It will only be feasible for the ambulance service to 'do more' in helping people access care closer to home if the primary and community care mentioned, much of which is currently and will be in the future provided by nurses, is funded and resourced appropriately. If not, the default will remain transportation to A&E regardless of whether the clinical condition demands it.
