The RCN has launched a new interactive race equity resource, <u>Taking Time to Talk: Advancing Race Equity in Nursing and Midwifery</u>, developed in partnership with NHS England.

The resource has been developed to help people better understand race dynamics at work. It covers microaggressions, psychological safety and allyship – as well as actions we can all take to promote race equity and how to speak up and get help.

RCN launches independent sector employment standards

Fair pay, terms and conditions – including pay scales, job evaluation schemes and equitable policies for staff – are all incorporated in our new RCN Employment Standards for Independent Health and Social Care Sectors.

The 7 standards outline what we expect from employers of nursing staff in the independent health and social care sectors. For members, the employment standards state what nursing staff should expect from their employer, while for RCN representatives they highlight what they should seek from employers on behalf of members.

Fertility Preservation

This publication provides information for nurses who are supporting and caring for those beginning treatment for potentially life-limiting diseases and where the treatment may adversely affect their ability to have children in the future. This updated guidance also encompasses those who may wish, for non-medical reasons, to defer having children until later in life, for example, members of the armed forces, transgender people, or those considering gender reassignment surgery.


